Head coach Tom Gill enters his 16th season as the head coach of the United States Merchant Marine Academy Lacrosse Mariners. Over the course of his tenure, he has led Kings Point to a ledger of 102-107, while improving his mark to 147-140 in his 20 years of coaching. In 1999 Coach Gill became the all-time winningest coach in the program's history. In addition to his coaching duties, Gill also acts as Assistant Athletics Director for the Academy.

In his 15 seasons, Gill has guided the Mariners to the inaugural Knickerbocker Conference Championship in 2000, two Hudson Valley Lacrosse League Championships, three HVLL Division Titles, eight ECAC Metro NY/NJ Championship appearances, and six consecutive Maritime Tournament Crowns. He was named the 1997-98 Academy Coach of the Year.

Prior to arriving at Kings Point, Gill coached the Devils of Farleigh Dickerson University-Madison from 1984-88, where he was 45-33 in five seasons and won an ECAC Championship. He has also served as an assistant coach at Cornell, Duke and Hofstra Universities.

On the administrative front, Gill is on the board of the NCAA Division III Lacrosse Championship, All-America Selection and Regional Advisory Committees. He is also a member of the Board of Directors of the Long Island Metropolitan Lacrosse Foundation, the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association Rules Committee and the ECAC Board of the USILA. He has served as an Assistant Coach for the Irish National Team that competed at the World Championships in Perth, Australia. He played professionally for the New York Saints, served as an alternate in the 1982 World Games and was selected to compete as a member of the USA Team in 1994, 1996 and 2001. He coached numerous clinics in Argentina, Australia and Ireland. In his leisure, coach Gill can be found in New York City enjoying a number of plays on and off Broadway.

A graduate of Hofstra, where he played for the Flying Dutchmen, Gill earned his Master's Degree in Education Administration from the University of North Carolina and has subsequently earned a second Master of Education from Hofstra in addition to his School Supervisory Certificate. Gill resides in Levittown, New York with his wife, Eileen, have one son, Brian.

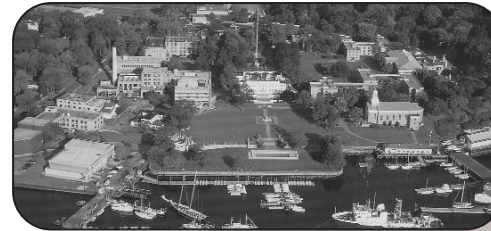

THIS IS KINGS POINT



The United States Merchant Marine Academy was dedicated on September 30, 1943, at the former Walter P. Chrysler estate in Kings Point, NY.

Kings Point, which is one of the five federal academies, has grown in stature and has become one of the world's foremost institutions in the field of maritime education. Midshipmen select their major course of study from among six major programs: Marine Transportation, Marine Operations and Technology, Marine Engineering, Marine Engineering Systems, Shipyard and Marine Engineering Management, and Logistics and Intermodal Transportation. Upon graduation, Midshipmen will receive a degree in their chosen major, a Coast Guard License to sail in the above capacities, and a commission as an Ensign in the United States Naval Reserve.

An integral part of the Academy curriculum is the training Midshipmen receive at sea. During their four years, Midshipmen spend approximately half of their sophomore and junior years aboard merchant vessels, sailing the trade routes of the world. This experience allows Midshipmen to explore the maritime field and travel the world.

Today, graduates are serving with distinction in all sectors of the maritime industry - as ship's officers, steamship company executives, admiralty lawyers, marine underwriters, naval architects, oceanographers, and career officers in the United States Navy, Coast Guard, Army, Air Force, and Marine Corps.

2006 LACROSSE SEASON OUTLOOK

The 2006 United States Merchant Marine Academy Lacrosse Mariners will look to build upon last seasons Knickerbocker Conference semi-final berth and 4-2 league mark. Sixteenth year head coach Tom Gill returns a young vibrant team of 21 from last season's roster, in addition to ten newcomers.

USMMA returns most of its offensive firepower to the squad with the exception of Matt McCarthy '05, who finished third on the team with a total of 29 points coming via 19 goals and 10 assists. All eyes will be on junior attackman **Sean Dougherty**, who enters the campaign as one of the most prolific scorers in program history. Dougherty, whom earned Second-Team All-Knickerbocker honors, recorded a team-best 49 points on 41 goals and eight assists. He enters the season with a two-year career total of 75 goals and 15 assists for 90 points. In 2005, the Ellicot City, Maryland native was ranked nationally as the tenth best scorer in the NCAA.

The Mariners also return junior attackman **Jim Flannery**, who was second on the squad in scoring with 36 points via 22 goals and 14 assists. Coach Gill will also look for returning sophomore **Ian Callery** and senior **Tony McDonald** for offense. The duo combined for 30 points in 2005.

Other players who will aid to the attack include senior **Jimmy Braudt** and talented freshmen **Brennan Dougherty** and **Robert De Pol**.

In the midfield, McDonald will likely see most of the face-offs this season. In 2005 the Weymouth, Massachusetts native was second on the team in face offs won and fourth in ground balls. Others to man the midfield include seniors **Brendan Myers**, **Matt Scott** and **Frank Toner**, juniors **Bryan Gray**, **Tony Buleza** and **Scott Hughes**, sophomore **Jonathan Odell**, and freshmen **Kevin Miernicki** and **Brett Daniels**.

Gill will look to his leaders to man the last line of defense. Sophomore **Michael Maginnis** was among the three USMMA Second-Team All-Knickerbocker members to return to the unit in '06. Seniors **Mike Citarelli** (co-captain) will be looked to for leadership and toughness in front of the net, while juniors **Lyle Armacost**, **Erik Anderson** and **Jim Clarkeson**, sophomore **Tom Shannon** and **Ryan Merritt** and freshmen **Michael Condron**, **Zach Brown**, **Matthew Faulks**, and **Daniel Schanno** will add depth to the position.

"We looking to the seniors for leadership on the field and off in addition to our newcomers, most of which are Division I capable," said Gill. "We're looking to fill some holes defensively. We're looking for someone to step up into the long stick position."

Returning to goal is Second-Team All-Knickerbocker member **John Pagano**, who stood strong in the net for the Mariners in 2005. The West Islip, New York native recorded 154 saves while succumbing to 121 goals allowed in 683 minutes. Pagano will look to improve upon last year's .560 save percentage, while lowering his 10.63 goals against average.

"Pagano enters his third year," remarked Gill. "He's improved in many aspects of the game we expect for him to improve on what he has done the past years."

Serving as backups in goal will be sophomore **Robert Boyd** and freshman **Timothy McGovern**.

The Mariners will compete in 15 regular season contest during the 2006 campaign, including a trip to Colorado Springs, Colorado to engage in battle with Colorado and Whittier Colleges on March 11 and 12. Kings Point will see much of a home-field with eight of the 15 contest being played in the confines of Captain Tomb Field, where USMMA will play host to Mount Saint Vincent*, Vassar, Williams, Stockton*, Union, Manhattanville*, Stevens Tech* and Maritime*. The Academy will play its remaining seven games on the road at Montclair State*, Scranton (PA), Kean University*, Centenary* and Farmingdale State*.

"This could be the best team in my tenure as head coach at Kings Point," remarked Gill. "We have more depth than we had in the past and our roster is filled with talented young players. The chemistry and camaraderie of our team is good. They respect each other on and off the field. They work hard and that hopefully will translate to wins. I'm pretty confident in our team's ability to make a run at the championship."

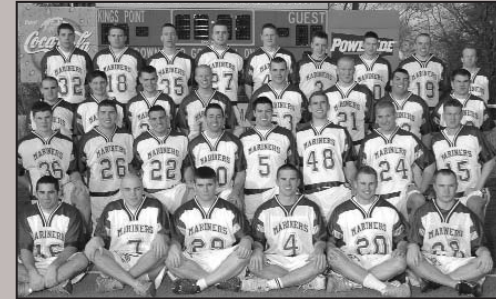
